The Personal Shopper Experience Online

Your USP (Unique Selling Point) is your taste. Your website should reflect this. Instead of just listing products, create "Edits" or "Lookbooks." "The Wedding Guest Edit" or "Weekend Casuals."

This curation helps the customer. It mimics the advice you would give in-store. You can also integrate a "Chat with a Stylist" button (via WhatsApp or a chatbot) where customers can ask questions like "Does this have stretch?" or "What shoes go with this?" responding personally replicates the boutique service and builds a relationship that fast fashion sites can never match.

Flash Sales and Countdown Timers

Boutiques often have limited stock. Use this to your advantage. Scarcity creates urgency. If you only have two dresses left in size 10, the website should say so.

Implementing smart marketing tools like countdown timers for flash sales or "Back in Stock" email notifications drives sales. If a customer misses out on a sold-out item, they can sign up to be notified if it returns. This captures the lead and guarantees a sale if you restock. It turns inventory management into a marketing tool.
